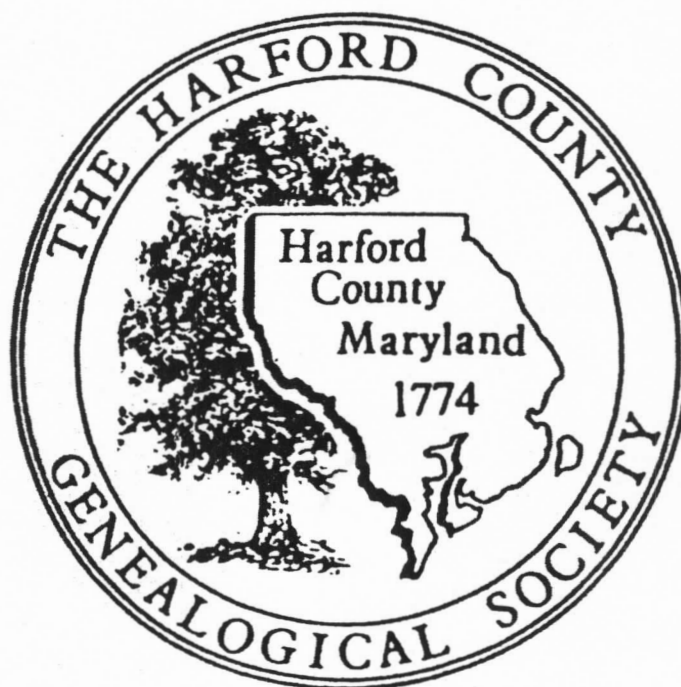

Utilizing her own research, some of these early records, plus varied bits-and-pieces of church histories; Peggy has produced this Special Publication for our Society. She has brought together the stories of a selected group of often forgotten churches, censuses of their cemeteries and the connected families who were important in the historic evolution of Harford County. We hope others will be inspired to produce similar records for other 'forgotten' churches and their cemeteries in other parts of the county.

An Index of Surnames has been compiled to facilitate your research, and is included at the end, along with a complete Bibliography. Where available, pictures of these Older Churches or their Cemeteries have been included with the brief history.

It is hoped that this Special Publication of the Harford County Genealogical Society provides a practical gathering of reference materials related to eleven old churches in our County. Each of the churches mentioned is accompanied by a location description, and a short history, plus transcriptions of tombstone engravings, for those churches that have graveyards. Hence, this publication derives its title, Older Churches and Their Forgotten Families.

INTRODUCTION

This publication covers a few Harford County churches that are little known today. They were closed due to people moving away or the congregations falling off and joining other churches. In some cases where the church closed, the building was dismantled and the lumber reused. The church furnishings were sold and the money was put in a fund for perpetual care of the cemetery. Where the buildings were constructed of brick or stone, other denominations have gotten their start there and also kept down vandalism.

In doing general church and cemetery research in Harford County, it was interesting to find that at least four churches were built of Rock Ridge Granite. They are William Watters Memorial United Methodist, Cherry Hill (Rock Ridge) Primitive Baptist, Holy Cross Episcopal, and Bethel Presbyterian. Three of these churches are still active today with the exception of Cherry Hill (Rock Ridge) Primitive Baptist. Cherry Hill (Rock Ridge) is no longer standing and the cemetery is gone. The rock ridge granite was "quarried" from the Rocks area.

Some of the church write-ups were written by a former church member or descendant. This, I think, gives it a little more personal view. Hopefully, I have not made any serious errors and you might just find a "lost" ancestor.

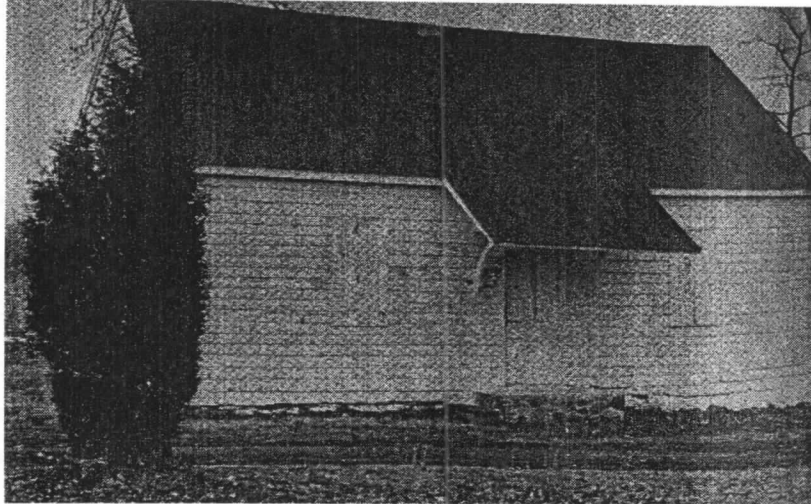

BROAD CREEK QUAKER MEETING

Broad Creek Quaker Meeting House was located on Scarboro (Scarborough) Road between Dublin Road (MD-440) and Whiteford Road (MD-136) at Quaker Church Road. This location is marked as "*Friends M.H*" on Martenet's 1878 Map of Harford County, in the area north of "*Union X Roads*" and west of "*Dublin P.O.*"

HISTORY

Broad Creek Quaker Meeting was organized in 1828 and the building was dismantled in 1968. There is a plaque marking the location of the Meeting House. The cemetery, still used occasionally, is set back from the road. The old Quaker marble markers have become eroded over the years and are very hard to read.

The following article was read at the Friends Association of Broad Creek Meeting on 12th month, 11 day, 1898 by Sarah R. G. Jackson.

FRIENDS OF BROAD CREEK FROM 1828 TO 1927

Very few Friends immigrated to Harford County from the Old World and many of those who came moved on to the neighboring colony in Pennsylvania, namely the colony under the leadership of William Penn, the most outstanding colony of Friends which settled in America. The Friends left in Harford County were scattered, so very few meetinghouses were constructed. Friends traveled many miles over bad roads to attend meetings held in the meetinghouse nearest their homes.

Broad Creek Meeting was the fourth one of its kind to be established in Harford County. It was in the year 1828 that Friends residing in the neighborhood of Broad Creek applied to Deer Creek Monthly Meeting of Darlington for the privilege to hold a meeting somewhere in their respective locality and they received a grant to hold "indulged" meetings. By this was meant that these Friends might meet for the purpose of worship on account of the distance of the Deer Creek Meeting being so great that it prevented many in the

discharging of their religious duties, but no power was given them to carry on any business whatsoever, this being carried on entirely in the Deer Creek Meeting.

The Friends of Broad Creek did not have a meeting house, so the meetings were carried on in a private dwelling house situated on the road leading from Union X Roads to Dublin, about one quarter mile from the X Roads, the house sitting back about 100 yards from the road. This dwelling was an old-fashioned log structure, which had been formerly occupied by Samuel and Letitia Scarborough.

There is a legend told of how the present site for the meetinghouse was chosen which I would relate here to the best of my ability. A Friend of the community in the early morning of each First Day, as Sunday is called by the Friends, used to walk to the piece of land on which now stands the present meetinghouse and there he sat on a log until the spirit moved him to return to his home. One First Day morning another Friend seeing this Friend sitting in this quiet and peaceful grove went and joined him in his Meditations. The spirit moved them to arise and shake hands later on in the morning. It was decided by them that this was a well-suited place for the Friends Meeting. It is not known whether this is the true legend or not, but it is believed by many and I am sure any one who has had the pleasure to attend this meeting will agree with me that this piece of land is well suited for this purpose. This spot is situated on the road leading from Macton to the Union X Roads, about 1/4 mile from the latter. It was purchased in 1830 and the sum paid for it was \$31.12-1/2. Since then another small tract of land has been added to be used as burial grounds and within the past few years, it has been made into a cemetery.

The meeting house constructed on this piece of land was not a lofty structure towering above the trees that encircle it, but a plain, frame building, unpretentious and humble in its appearance having in it six windows which make a very cheerful meeting-room. Wooden benches with high and straight backs were used, placed so as to have two in front facing the doors, which were two in number and the rest facing these. This meetinghouse was divided, by partition into two parts, the women meeting on one side and the men on the other. All business papers were passed from one side to the other. The partitions were later torn out and joint meetings were held. One door then took the place of two. Old-fashioned tinplate stoves heated this building until a more recent date when these were removed and replaced by a large substantial box stove. Clay bricks were heated on this stove and any one having cold feet in wintertime had the privilege of their use.

Among the members who composed, this meeting when it was first begun may be mentioned; the following are: Aseph Warner, who sat at the head of the meeting, his wife Ruth, and their children; Pamela, Ruth, Silas, Thomas, who married Mary Ann Wooley, and Letitia who married Samuel Scarborough. William McCoy and Priscilla, his wife, and their children who were named, David G., who married Eliza H. Jones of Baltimore, William, who married Sarah Coale of Deer Creek; Martha, Rachel, Mary, Hannah,

Sarah, Joseph, and Joshua Harmer. Doubtless there many others whose names have passed from the memory of passing generations.

It may be said of David G. McCoy, whose name you will find mentioned above that he had more than ordinary ability. He was; one of the earliest promoters of the present school system of Harford County. In the bridge that spans the Susquehanna at Conowingo is found what was thought to be a lasting monument to his energy and public spirit; for its erection was largely due to his efforts, but now since the new dam is being constructed most likely this bridge will be torn down and a new one built farther down the stream. In 1870, he sat at the head of the meeting, which was then comprised of 64 members. After his death, which occurred 1st month, 8th, 1881, John H. Stokes, Sr., took his place at the head of the meeting.

During the spring of 1849, a public school was opened at this meetinghouse, and Thomas Clement was appointed teacher. It was largely attended and on the Fourth Day of each week, the pupils were dismissed for an hour while mid-week meetings were held. Those who wished to remain for the meeting were allowed to do so.

It was not until seventh month 1865 that this meeting became an established meeting of discipline. It was at this time they began to hold their own Preparative and Monthly Meetings. The Preparative Meeting was and is still held on the First Day in every month. Their Monthly Meeting was held on the second Fifth Day of each month, but it has now been changed. It is held on the third First Day of each month. Any Friend wishing to be married in the Friends Meeting must attend two of these Meetings and make their intentions public.

The first First Day School, as Sunday School is called by the Friends, was established in this meeting about 1870. This school did not make much progress until about 1895 when it was reorganized and has since increased rapidly each year after year. The present superintendent of this First Day School is Dr. James Harry. Each year during the latter part of August or the first of September, a celebration is held on the lawn in front of the meetinghouse. People from far and near attend this "gathering." A large dinner is prepared, cooked, and served out in the open. The children played games and some times contests are arranged for them

The Friends held what they called Scripture Bees, from year to year, meeting at the different meetinghouses. In the year 1923, this Scripture Bee was held at Broad Creek.

Each year a few of the Friends of Broad Creek, chosen by the Monthly Meeting, are sent as representatives to their Yearly Meeting held in Baltimore where they report the business of the past year and make plans for the coming year.

CHERRY HILL (ROCK RIDGE) BAPTIST MEETING

Rock Ridge Baptist Meeting was located on the northwest side of Cherry Hill Road, about one-quarter mile southwest of Grier Nursery Road from 1817 to c.1880. This location is marked as “*Church*” on Martenet’s 1878 Map of Harford County, in the area now known as Cherry Hill.

Over time, this church was alternatively known as Rock Ridge Regular Baptist Society, Old Rock Ridge Baptist Meeting, Rock Ridge Baptist Church, Meeting House of the Rocks, Cherry Hill Meeting House, and Cherry Hill Primitive Baptist Church.

HISTORY

The following article was taken from an old clipping that was printed in the Bel Air Times, 1926, and was entered in a DAR contest. It was furnished to the paper by Miss Helen Lucille Kinhart, and had been prepared with much pain and research.

“The story will be of much interest to many people, who have frequently inquired about the establishment of this old church on the road from the Old Preston Mill property to Cherry Hill. Nothing but the walls of this ancient House of God remain, but many of the descendants of the original founders and landowners take a prominent part in the community. To Miss Kinhart, as well as the Editor of this paper, owe a debt of gratitude for the furnishing in compact form this account, which constitutes a part of the History of our County.” [D.A.R. Editor]

The Old Baptist Church or Meeting House of The Rocks was built on a part of the ground that was deeded to Stephen Rigdon, the ancestor of the present Rigdon family of the Fourth District, in the year 1696, for the sum of eight shillings per acre and a year's crop, to be paid in gold and silver. The entire tract consisted of 1700 acres of land, called “Rock Quarters.”

The grantee, Stephen Rigdon, was an ardent believer in the cause of the colonies, and after fighting during the entire War was discharged with the rank of Captain.

In 1827, Captain Alexander Rigdon willed this territory to another Stephen Rigdon and his heirs. This tract of 1700 acres was known more than a century ago as the home of the Mingo and the Susquehannock Indians, the famous river of that name being called after the latter tribe. They had several villages along Deer Creek, one being named Mingo Push, after the chief of the tribe. These Indians had many battles among the rocks and hills of Rock Ridge, and this was their happy hunting ground, for today are still found darts, axes, and tomahawks, and the caverns of the Rocks, called Indian cupboards still show the handiwork of these aborigines.

In the fall of the year the Indians would burn over the barrens, and from the great smoke arising, tradition says the name of Indian Summer is derived. The Indians were gradually driven out by the whites, the last battle having taken place at Conestoga, Pa., and the remnants of the local tribes were driven North and East and they constitute now only a tradition in this old neighborhood.

This 1,700 acre tract is now, at this writing, 1926, owned by the following named citizens; Mrs. Charles Kennedy, Mrs. Charles Sweeting, Mr. Benj. F. Rigdon, who are direct heirs of Captain Stephen Rigdon, and the farm now owned by Crowl Brothers constituted the original homestead. Other occupants of the old tract are Messrs. Charles and Carroll Crowl, Mr. James Stewart, Grier[sic] Brothers Nursery, Messrs. W. H. Worrell, Charles Ayres, E. L. Grier, John T. Carter, John Folker, and William A. Grafton. Mine Old Fields constitutes a part of this tract. The 4-H Club Camp of the boys and girls of Harford County also constitutes a part of the Rigdon grant. This was purchased in the year 1925 by the club and consists of nearly 200 acres, now improved by dormitories, a mess hall, and a fine swimming pool. This beautiful spot also blessed with a spring of pure crystal water, which was described in The Times a year ago in a delightful story written by Mr. Harold G. Smithson as the place where the Indian princess appeared to him when he lifted his head from drinking of the delicious nectar. This is one of several springs for which Rock Ridge is noted, and they have been analyzed and found singularly pure.

Mine Old Fields is located on the road from Cherry Hill to Emory Church, and consists of about 200 acres. On this land the late Stanley Rogers mined iron ore and carried it to the old furnace, the remains of which are yet seen near the bridge crossing Deer Creek just above the Rocks. Mine Old Fields is now owned by Mr. Henry Pleasants, a lawyer and author of Philadelphia. Mr. Pleasants is making a preserve for wild game and has improved the property with a beautiful log cabin along pioneer lines, consisting of five rooms with a large stone fireplace. It is built on a high ridge, furnishing a magnificent View of the surrounding country, and is equipped with the furniture of long ago.

In 1817, Stephen Rigdon a descendant of Captain Rigdon, built of stone quarried in the immediate neighborhood, Rock Ridge Baptist Church, or as sometimes called, Cherry Hill Meeting House. The building was erected before the land was deeded for the purpose, but in 1831 Stephen Rigdon deeded two acres to the following trustees, Messrs. John DeVoe, Martin Grafton, William Streett, James Jenkins, and Stephen Rigdon, styling them trustees of the Rock Ridge Regular Baptist Society or Church, and their successors in office forever, the said land and Church to be used for the sole use and benefit of the Church. Later Stephen Rigdon, by his Will, bequeathed 138 acres of land to the above named trustees, the profits of which were to be applied to the support of a regular Baptist minister of the Meeting House.

This church was built of stone and was 25 feet wide and 50 feet long and 20 feet high and had a star cut in soapstone in the gable end. It was supported by large square posts 14 x 14 inches, reaching, from the purlines {horizontal timbers supporting the roof} to the floor. The roof was of slate and the building had three entrances, a double door leading from the main road, one from the West side, with large steps up to the gallery, where

the slaves worshipped. The pulpit was located in the North end, surrounded by railing. It also had two large stone entrances. The pulpit was built four or five feet from the floor, and under this was a cupboard, where were placed the rough boxes that arrived before the time for burial. The church had ten windows, three in the rear or North, two in the South, three in the West side and two in the East, and was heated by two large tin plate stoves.

The first record of preaching there was when the Rev. William Wilson, better known to the country-side as "Parson" Wilson, with part of the congregation that left the old Baptist Church of Jarrettsville, on account of a dispute over temperance, in 1839, when he went to Rock Ridge, which had been built a long time before that. Among the first members who attended service there were Messrs. William DeVoe, Martin Grafton, Daniel Amos, Stephen Rigdon, James Grafton, Elmer Thomas, and Mesdames Anne DeVoe, Martha Grafton, Sarah Amos, Martha Rigdon, and Margaret Grafton, and Misses Elizabeth Rigdon, Anne Gladden, and Mary Gladden.

They subscribed to the following creed:

"We whose names have been written before I have by Grace been enabled to give up ourselves unto the Lord and likewise to one another, and do hereby in the fear of the Lord's covenant agree to walk with each other in humility and brotherly love, to watch over each other's conversation, to stir up each other to love and good works, to warn and rebuke when cases require it with the Spirit of the Gospel, to maintain the worship and ordinances of God's house and not to forsake the assembling of ourselves together, and earnestly to obtain the faith once delivered to the saints, and that whereas with the heart man believeth unto righteousness and with the mouth maketh confession unto salvation, we, therefore, do set forth this our declaration of faith as follows:

1. We believe in the one only true and living God, and that in the unity of the divine Grace, there does and always did exist, three equal and divine persons, The Father, The Son, and The Holy Ghost.

2. We believe in the eternal and personal election of all the people of God to grace and eternal glory hereafter, and that all were chosen in Christ as their head and representative.

3. We believe in a definite and particular redemption, by the blood of Jesus, as embracing all the elect and no other, and the atonement made by Christ is full and complete.

4. We believe that man was created upright, but by the fall, is totally depraved, dead in trespasses and sins, and that his recovery is wholly by the Grace of God in Christ Jesus.

5. We believe in the full and free eternal justification of all the elect, through and by the reputed righteousness of Jesus Christ.

6. We believe in applications of Grace regeneration, and that all the elect in the appointed time will be effectually called in the image of God.

7. We believe that all the saints will be kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation, ready to be re-created in the last time.

8. We believe in the resurrection of all the dead, and a general judgment, and that the happiness of the righteous, and misery of the wicked, will both alike be interminable.

9. We believe that none but believers are proper subjects of Christian Baptism, and immersion is the only Scriptural way, and faithful brethren, who have upon profession of faith been baptized, are proper subjects of church membership.

10. We believe the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments to be the only rule of faith and practice and that they are profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction and for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be perfect, thoroughly furnished unto all good works, and that all human inventions, all societies, other than the Church of Christ, are commandments of men, whatever their object may profess to be, whether moral or religious, are anti-Christian in their principle and tendency, and hereby we declare a man fellowship for, them, and to all who are connected with thee or in any wise aid or support them, and name all and each of these articles, and look upon ourselves, to maintain, and defend, and to require all others who may hereafter unite with us to subscribe to, believing it to be our duty to stand fast in one spirit with one mind, striving together for the faith of the Gospel, this eleventh day of May, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eighteen hundred and thirty-nine."

The first meeting was held May the 11th, 1839, and the church appointed Brother Martin Grafton and Brother John DeVoe as Deacons of the church.

In August 1839, Ann Alexander applied for baptism, and having a work of grace and experience in her soul satisfactory to the Church, was received and baptized the same day by Brother William Wilson.

In 1850, Brother Stephen Rigdon requested to be restored, and he was.

They then appointed Brother Stephen Rigdon clerk to keep the church records. He was later appointed a trustee.

In 1873, more members were taken in, namely: Messrs. Elisha Reynolds, Milton Dance, Joseph Dance, James Alexander, William Watkins, John Watkins, Nathan Grafton, and Corbin Grafton.

In 1870, William Grafton was elected as Elder to preach at church, on account of the illness of Rev. Wilson. There was a meeting called to fill the vacancies in the Board of Trustees of this house or lot, occasioned by the death of three trustees, and Messrs. William Streett, John DeVoe, and Stephen Rigdon, Jr., were appointed.

In 1870, Nathan Grafton was appointed clerk. They then voted by ballot to fill the above vacancies of the Board.

In July, 1873, the following men were appointed as the remaining trustees, namely, Messrs. Milton Dance, Nathan Grafton, and John Watkins.

On account of so many religious disputes they never organized, and the furniture was transferred by Elder William Grafton to La Grange Colored Church, and on account of its unsafe condition it has been dismantled.

For many years after the church had been closed, services were held in the grove under the supervision of Rev. Albert Parker.

And in the past year Sunday School has been held in the school house next to the church under the supervision of Rev. Albert Price.

This church property is now in the hands of the Rigdon heirs, and the present custodian, Mr. C. W. Sweeting, is willing to give the land back to any organization that would build up the church.

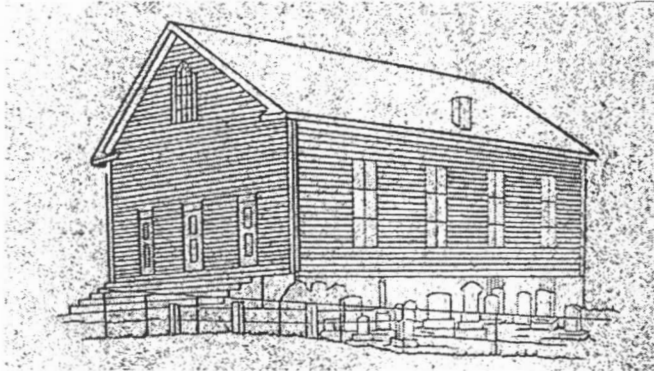

FELLOWSHIP METHODIST CHURCH

The Fellowship Cemetery is located one mile north of Harkins Road (MD-136) on the west side of Fawn Grove Road between Scott Road and McDermott Road. This location is marked as "*Fellowship Ch*" on Martenet's 1878 Map of Harford County, in the area now known as Pylesville. A monument has been placed outside the cemetery to mark the location of the church and has both a building sketch and a brief history carved on it.

HISTORY

The monument reads as follows:

FELLOWSHIP CHURCH & CEMETERY

ON FEBRUARY 25, 1820, JOHN WRIGHT, SR., JOHN WRIGHT, JR., WILLIAM MANIFOLD, WILLIAM WRIGHT, JOHN GAILEY, DAVID HARTMAN, AND HENRY AMOS, ACTING AS TRUSTEES, RECEIVED A DEED FROM ABRAHAM JARRETT TO "A LOT OF LAND LYING ON THE NORTH SIDE OF DEER CREEK BEING PART OF A TRACT CALLED WILD CAT DEN... SUBJECT TO THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS... THAT THEY SHALL ERECT AND BUILD A HOUSE OF WORSHIP FOR THE USE OF MEMBERS OF THE METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH IN THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA." THIS MARKS THE BEGINNING OF FELLOWSHIP CHURCH. THE ASSUMPTION IS THAT A SMALL LOG CHURCH WAS BUILT ON THE PROPERTY WHERE THE CEMETERY IS NOW LOCATED. IN 1867, ON ADDITIONAL LAND OBTAINED FROM RACHEL AND RUFUS LOWE, THE CONGREGATION ERECTED A LARGE FRAME BUILDING WITH THREE FRONT DOORS OPENING ONTO WOODEN STEPS EXTENDING ACROSS THE ENTIRE FRONT OF THE CHURCH.

THE CHURCH WAS TORN DOWN IN THE EARLY 1940's.

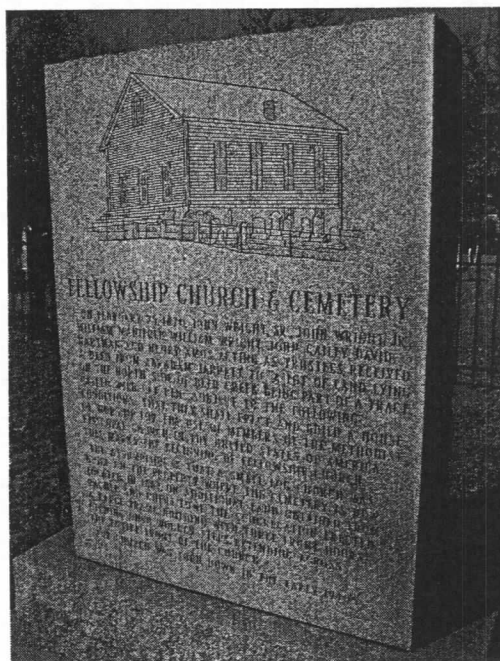
The incorporation of the church in 1892 was attested to by Rev. Trovilla Peters and Trustees who were Ezekiel J. Richardson, Emanuel Bulett, Henry S. Merryman, Abraham Trout, Louis E. Allen, George M. Wiley, and Ellsworth L. Lowe.

In 1913 when the West Harford Circuit was divided, Fellowship became a sister church to Centre, Friendship, and William Watters, the four of which comprised the Forest Hill Charge.

Progress in the form of automobiles and town church consolidations, sealed the doom of Fellowship Church. The once-active congregation dwindled until having a minister to serve there was an unjustifiable expense. Lay ministers were able to keep the church open for a while longer. Its survival was extended yet awhile longer when classes were held in the basement following the burning of the Summit Hall School. In the early 1940's, however, the church building was sold to Clark Sexton, who used the lumber to construct his home in Norrisville. The vacant lot created by the removal of the church is north of the cemetery and south of the adjoining property.

Friends and neighbors maintain the cemetery, as do the following trustees: Mrs. James Arnold, Charles Brooks, Neal DeVoe, Woodrow Devoe, Rex Hankins, Hayward Richardson, Mrs. Milton Smith, James Wiley - Treasurer, Mrs. Hugh DeVoe -Finance Chairman, and Mrs. Ross Wiley.

FOREST QUAKER MEETING ("OLD" On Sharon Road)

Old Forest Meeting was located on Sharon Road, between Rigdon Road and Stirrup Run crossing approximately one and one half miles south of Rocks Road (MD-24) and the current Gunpowder State Park – Rocks Area (aka Rocks State Park). This location is not specifically marked on Martenet's 1878 Map of Harford County, but is across the road to the northeast from "*Francis Way*" in the area northeast of "**Cooptown P.O.**"

HISTORY

Quaker Meetings were held for two years in a log house owned by Abraham Huff.

The cemetery was established in 1815 before the meetinghouse was erected. There were approximately 60 burials made between 1814 -1889. The grave markers were moved in 1973 to the Friends Cemetery at Forest Hill and placed around the stonewall. A bronze plaque is mounted on the wall stating the origin of these tombstones.

FOREST QUAKER MEETING ("NEW" In Forest Hill)

The Forest Quaker Meeting House was located on Jarrettsville Road, in what is now Friends Park, about one-quarter mile east of Rocks Road (MD-24) in the village of Forest Hill. This location is marked as "*Friends M.Ho.*" on Martenet's 1878 Map of Harford County, in the area "**Forest Hill P.O.**"

HISTORY

In 1850, a tract of land was purchased on Jarrettsville Road just east of Rocks Road in Forest Hill. A frame building was constructed there in late 1850. A cemetery was also established here. The cemetery was enclosed by a stone wall in 1914. The meeting house was dismantled in 1942, but the cemetery remains. The balance of the 11-acre parcel was leased to the Harford County Department of Parks and Recreation, and is known as Friends Park.

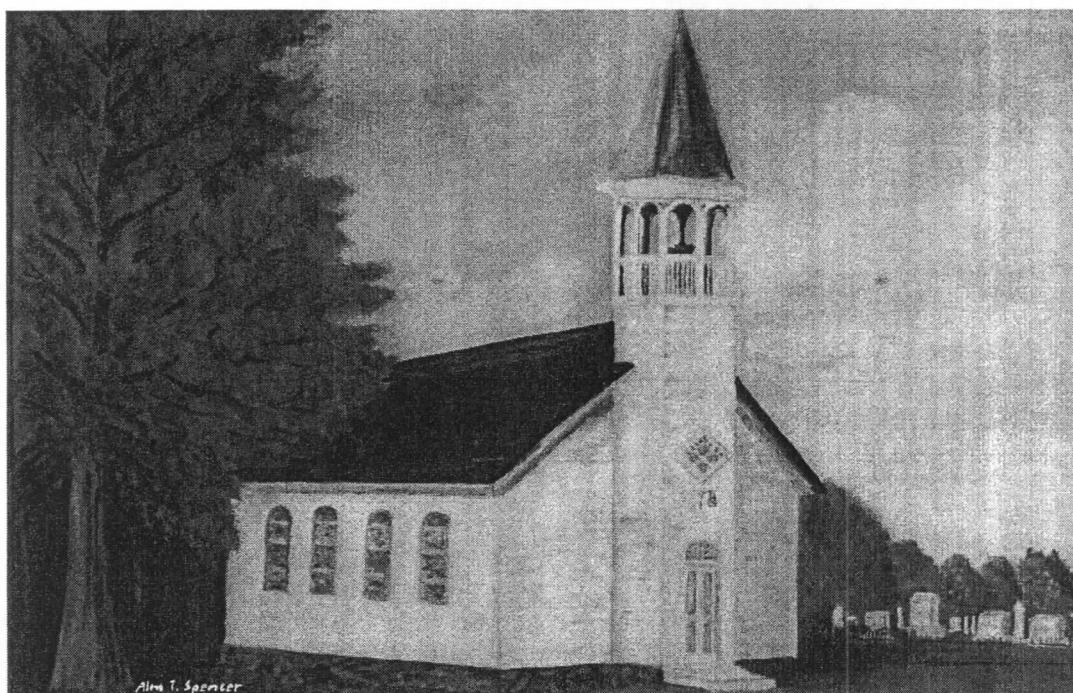

GOODWILL EVANGELICAL CHURCH

Goodwill Evangelical Church was, located on the north side of Hess Road between Fallston Rd (MD-152) and Jarrettsville Pike (MD-146), near Suffolk Lane and Park Road. This location is marked as “**Good Will Ch**” on Martenet’s 1878 Map of Harford County, in the area of “**Upper X Roads**” and southeast of “**Taylor P.O.**”

HISTORY

Goodwill Evangelical Church was built around 1870, but the exact date of construction is unknown. The land was deeded to the church by Amanda Z. Howard. The building was a frame structure and there was never a corner stone.

With the founding of Goodwill, the Jarrettsville Charge included four Evangelical churches Tabernacle, LaGrange, Salem, and Goodwill.

In 1894, a denominational split occurred. Salem and LaGrange remained with the parent denomination. Due to various reasons and closeness of other Evangelical churches, the congregation’s membership started falling off.

Eventually the church was dismantled in 1975 and a monument was erected using the foundation stones to support the bell from the steeple. Goodwill had survived the splits and isolation only to become a victim of the 1968 Methodist – Evangelical United Brethren (EUB) merger. The property and members of Goodwill transitioned to Ebenezer United Methodist Church. Today, the Ebenezer congregation continues to maintain the bell monument and Cemetery.

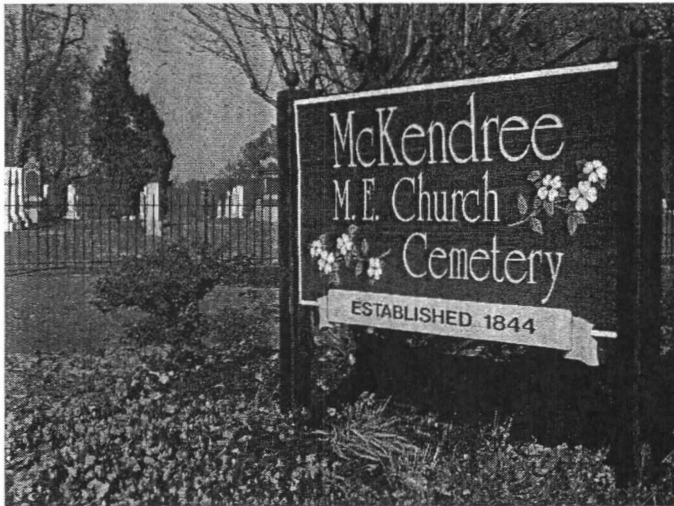

MCKENDREE METHODIST CHURCH MCKENDRY METHODIST CHURCH

McKendree Methodist Church was located on the north side of Troyer Road less than one-half mile east of Norrisville Road (MD-23) in the area of Black Horse. This location is marked as “*Church*” on Martenet’s 1878 Map of Harford County, just east of “**Black Horse P.O.**” There is a stone marker in front of the cemetery, inside the fence, that designates the church location, with the inscription, “**SITE OF MCKENDREE M.E. CHURCH 1844 - 1945.**”

HISTORY

At a meeting of members and friends of the Methodist Episcopal Church at the home of Mrs. Sarah Henderson, the advisability of erecting a church in the community was discussed. The need for a church was felt because two class meetings were being held in various homes. One place for meeting was more logical. Under the leadership of Rev. Richard Brown, the pastor, plans were made to build the church, which became McKendree.

On September 18, 1843, the frame of the church was raised on the lot donated by Mr. Jacob Bradenbaugh, Sr. On December 4, 1843, the first Bible Class was held in the new but incomplete building. On January 28, 1844, the church was dedicated by Rev. John A. Collins assisted by Rev. David Thomas, Pastor.

The architect was Mr. Stabler, and the church was built at a cost of \$1,110.66 although additional costs were incurred by further improvements at later dates. In 1880, the church acquired a slate roof, a new carpet, and

a coat of paint. The building was embellished with Gothic windows and a tower, containing a belfry and a bell in 1899.

The declining membership was responsible for the decision at a Quarterly Conference held at Vernon Church on November 20, 1934 to close McKendree. Permission was given to the Trustees to sell the church and furniture. The proceeds, after payment of all debts, were to be placed in a trust fund for the upkeep of the cemetery. The trust fund became effective April 22, 1936.

HISTORY

THE HISTORY OF NORTH BEND CHURCH

By Mrs. William S. Gross (nee Florence Streett)

My parents decided to move to Harford County as my father's relatives lived around Deer Creek and he loved the country. His school vacations were spent on the Streett farm. We were members of the Presbyterian Church of the Covenant where Dr. Price was minister, coming from Bethel. He asked us to attend North Bend because church workers were needed. We did, and finally brought our letters to the church.

My father was Elder and Sunday School Superintendent. Both parents were teachers and I was the organist. We enjoyed working with the friendly people and loved the quaint church, which our ancestors had helped to build.

The Sunday School picnics in August were fun, when the families gathered some place outdoors with baskets of delicious food. There were games for all ages, ending with a special ice cream treat, gift of the Sunday School.

OLDER CHURCHES AND THEIR FORGOTTEN FAMILIES

In the fall, a big supper was prepared by the ladies of the church and was eaten on long tables in the churchyard. The supper was well attended by the community and the proceeds helped the church immensely.

At Christmas, I planned an entertainment of drills, dialogues, pageants, and carol singing. There was always a Christmas tree and Santa's arrival was signaled by the ringing of sleigh bells. He would have a large pack filled with oranges and boxes of candy for everyone.

In the spring, we were sure to have a strawberry and ice cream festival - fun for all.

On the serious side, we would have Revivals, held at night, and well attended by people from miles around. In June, we had a Children's Day service.

I remember one incident in particular. Dr. Price invited Rev. Mays and his group for a week's revival. That was really something! Rev. Mays would get right "happy" and would end the inside meeting on the outside of the church with singing and shouting of the "Amens." The old moonlit woods fairly rang with the noise, which could be heard for quite a distance.

Then there were the happy days when the young men would come all dressed up with their lady friends, riding in buggies, wagons, and horseback, to attend the evening services.

Then plans and talks began to form, and arrangements made to celebrate the 80th birthday of the old brick church. Speakers were obtained, programs for each evening were planned, and the celebration was under way. The weather was perfect and the attendance was tremendous. Some prominent men of the county wrote articles about the church. Following is part of an article from the Aegis written by Judge John A. Robinson:

The location of the church was among the hills of Little Creek and its rugged founders have always reminded me of the Scottish mountains.

The church was built in 1861, an offshoot of Bethel, for in those days, distance counted more than today.

There were 46 members then, 51 now, and the congregation averaging about 45 each Sunday.

Dr. William A. Price was minister of Highland and North Bend as it was under the Highland jurisdiction.

The founders of the church were the families who lived near Deer Creek. They were the St. Clairs, Slades, Streetts, Bairds, Calders, and others.

In 1898, North Bend was organized as an independent Church.

Next Sunday the descendants of the original families mentioned above and present members will gather to celebrate the erection of the little brick church on the North Bend Road.

The church was built in 1861 and the 80th anniversary was in 1941. Mr. Winskowski laid a new floor because the old floor was pretty well worn. My father, who was a paperhanger and decorator, painted and

decorated the walls. The ladies scrubbed and cleaned the windows, lamps, and stoves and made ready for the celebration.

All was ready and the big day arrived. The weather cooperated and the day was beautiful. People began arriving early and the woods rang with pleasant greetings from people who had not seen one another for a long time. It was really like a reunion.

The 80th anniversary was a success. Following a typical church service, vocal selections were given by Mrs. William S. Gross and Mr. Raymond Watkins, Mrs. Stewart O. Day (daughter of Rev. & Mrs. William A. Price); sermon by Rev. Bruce McDonald, Moderator; reading of the church history by Mr. Raymond Watkins; reading of the minutes of the first session meeting by Mr. T. C. Streett, Clerk of the Session. A roll call of the original members was called with eight charter members present. Flowers were presented to Mrs. Price, widow of Dr. Price, and Mrs. Stewart McKenzie, wife of the present minister (Bethel). A final hymn and benediction closed the service. The following article appeared in the next issue of the AEGIS.

Anniversary Week observed at North Bend

Six of Original Members attend Sunday's Service

Aegis, November 7, 1941

A large congregation of members and friends celebrated the eightieth anniversary of North Bend Church last Sunday. Six of the original fifty-two members who organized the church in 1898 were present to answer the roll call.

Mr. Ed Baird, who joined the church in 1893 when it was a part of Bethel Church, was the oldest person in point of years as a member. The others present were Mrs. Estella Trout, Mrs. Temperance Slade, Mrs. Eliza DeVoe, Mrs. Sadie Neeper, Mrs. Emma Woods, all of who were members before 1898. Mrs. Howard Coe and Mrs. Ida Tracy Boyd were the other two living members of the original group.

Outstanding personalities in the history of the church as it was given by Mr. Raymond Watkins, a former Elder, were Miss Sallie St. Clair and the late Dr. W. A. Price. Miss St. Clair a beloved character was for most of the early life of the church the spirit behind all its activities particularly the Sunday School. Dr. Price, during his two pastorates, did more than anyone else to strengthen the fellowship. Mr. James Baird was the leading Elder for many years.

The congregation on Sunday packed every corner of the church to renew old ties and listen to the Moderator of the Presbytery, Dr. Bruce McDonald, bring a message of greeting. Dr. Donald Miller spoke for Highland Church and Mr. Samuel Galbreath for Bethel with which North Bend was associated. The anniversary services have continued through this week with special preachers speaking each night. Next Sunday an evening of music has been planned. To this service at 8 P.M., the public is cordially invited.

So ended the 80th anniversary of North Bend Presbyterian Church, the little quaint brick church in the hills.

The names Street and Slade have been in the Sabbath School Records since 1857 to the present: Watkins from 1860.

On May 31, 1898, a commission from the Presbytery met at the North Bend preaching station for the purpose of organizing the congregation into a church. Rev. William A. Price was elected a member of the Commission.

The service began at two o'clock in the afternoon. Rev. J. Wynne Jones preached the sermon. The way clear, it was decided upon a motion to proceed to the organization of the church. Forty-five members were present. Herbert Ashton Streett was baptized, being the first one to receive Christian baptism in North Bend Presbyterian Church. Rev. Wynne Jones accepted the constitutional questions, which were proposed by the Moderator, by the uplifted hands. Mr. James Baird, Sr., and Mr. George B. Cummings were elected Elders; Deacons elected were E. P. Metzel, Peter Calary, Robert Baird, Bailey St. Clair, and James Baird, Jr.

The congregation was addressed by Rev. J. W. Campbell, the Elders by Rev. A. G. Parker, and Deacons by Rev. William Cummings. The Moderator then declared the church organized in accordance with the constitution of the Presbyterian Church. By unanimous vote of the members, the church was named North Bend Presbyterian Church and was to be reported to the Baltimore Presbytery for enrollment.

In June 1902, the salary promised to Rev. William A. Price was \$130 per annum, payable quarterly. In 1905, Rev. Price left to go to the Church of the Covenant, Baltimore.

In July 1906 - Jonas Barclay, minister.

In October 1906, Rev. L. Samuel Irving became pastor. Salary \$200

Rev. Price came back in 1923 and stayed until February 21, 1940, when he passed away. The salary then was \$400. Rev. Stewart McKenzie followed Rev. Price.

On April 28, 1928, three additional elders were elected: Edward Baird, Frederick Wagner, and T. Clarence Streett.

North Harford Baptist Church used this building from 1952 until they moved to the Dallas Sutton building (not the current c.1970 building) on Old Federal Hill Road in 1957. The old North Bend church building is currently (2008) occupied by the New Life Church of God congregation.

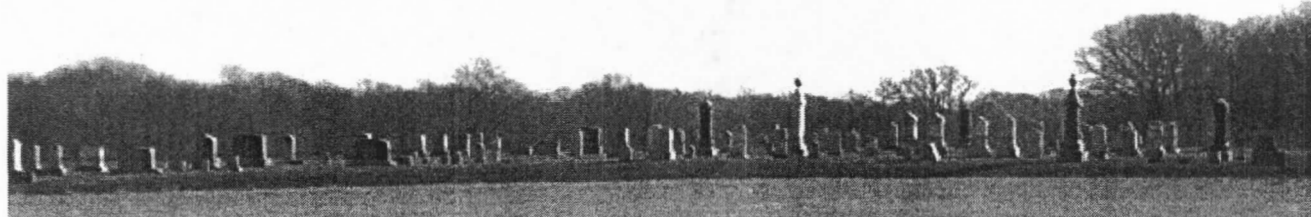

HISTORY

The Methodist, Baptists, and Presbyterians were well established in the Jarrettsville area when German people moved here around 1820 - 1840. As they settled in the Jarrettsville area, they started buying land. These German immigrants were shunned and made to feel unwelcome.

Until they could build their own church, they held their services in the home of Marcus Stengle. They wanted to hold services in their own language and similar to the Methodist ones in their old homeland. In the time period around 1855 - 1856, a small church was erected. As time passed, the congregation outgrew this small building. In 1887, a larger church was built. It prospered for many years until there was a split in the Evangelical Association and had problems of obtaining ministers for services. Membership started falling-off as younger members began attending services in neighboring churches. Calvary and Asbury Methodist churches became home to most of Salem's members, with a few moving to Bethel Presbyterian. By 1915, the only time the church was open was for funeral services. In 1927, the trustees sold the buildings and invested the money in an account for perpetual care of the cemetery.

The more recent Salem Evangelical Lutheran Church, on Norrisville Road (MD-23) across from Jarrettsville Elementary School, had its groundbreaking ceremonies after Easter 1968. There is absolutely no connection between the Salem Evangelical and Salem Lutheran churches, other than name and general location. The first Salem was associated with Evangelical Society of Germany, which was a Methodist organization, not Lutheran. Its affiliations were common with Goodwill, Tabernacle, and Fellowship Methodist Churches.

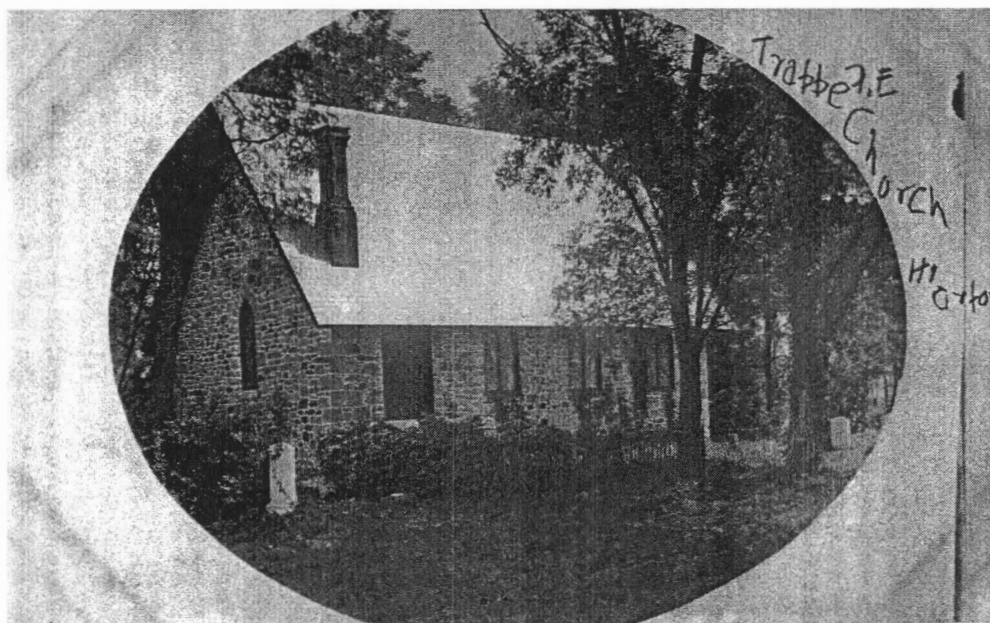

TRAPPE EPISCOPAL CHURCH
DEER CREEK PARISH of the EPISCOPAL DIOCESE OF MARYLAND

St. James Episcopal Church at Trappe, now the ruins of Trappe Church, was located in the village of Trappe, on Priestford Road (MD-136) between Trappe Road and Trappe Church Road. This location is marked as "*Epis. Ch*" on Martenet's 1878 Map of Harford County, in the area west of "**Glenville P.O.**" and east of "**Sandy Hook.**"

HISTORY

In early times when people were slowly moving inland and to the north, it became too great a distance to travel to Spesutie Church.

In 1761, the first Episcopal Church building at Trappe was built. It was known as St. James' and came under St. George's Parish (Spesutie). Eventually, St. James', and other churches were separated from St George's Parish to form Deer Creek Parish. The very early records of marriages, births, and deaths performed do not exist.

This first church fell into decay and was vandalized about 1800. The second church building, a frame structure erected in 1855, was dedicated as a Protestant Episcopal Church, USA, in 1858. This second building was destroyed by fire in 1869.

Church work was continued in borrowed buildings at Darlington, Trappe, and Scarborough during the years between the destruction of the old building and the erection of a new one. The rector continued to live in the rectory at Trappe until 1881, when the home was sold.

The first Episcopal Church at Darlington was erected in 1871 and was also a frame structure. The Trappe members were invited to join them, but they preferred to wait until their own church was rebuilt of stone in 1873, and it still stands today. The congregation later gradually fell-off and the church stood empty. Windows and doors of the church were lost and the grounds became overgrown.

The Vestry of Deer Creek Parish, along with the churches at Darlington and Scarborough fell heir to Trappe. An extensive job was done to clean-up the grounds. Some early headstones dating back 150 years (c.1800) were re-discovered during this effort.

"Trappe Missionary Baptist Church" leased the church building and grounds for a while at a nominal \$1.00 a year. Eventually, the Deer Creek Parish sold the Trappe church and grounds to the Baptist congregation. The congregation has continued to expend considerable effort to maintain the grounds and building.

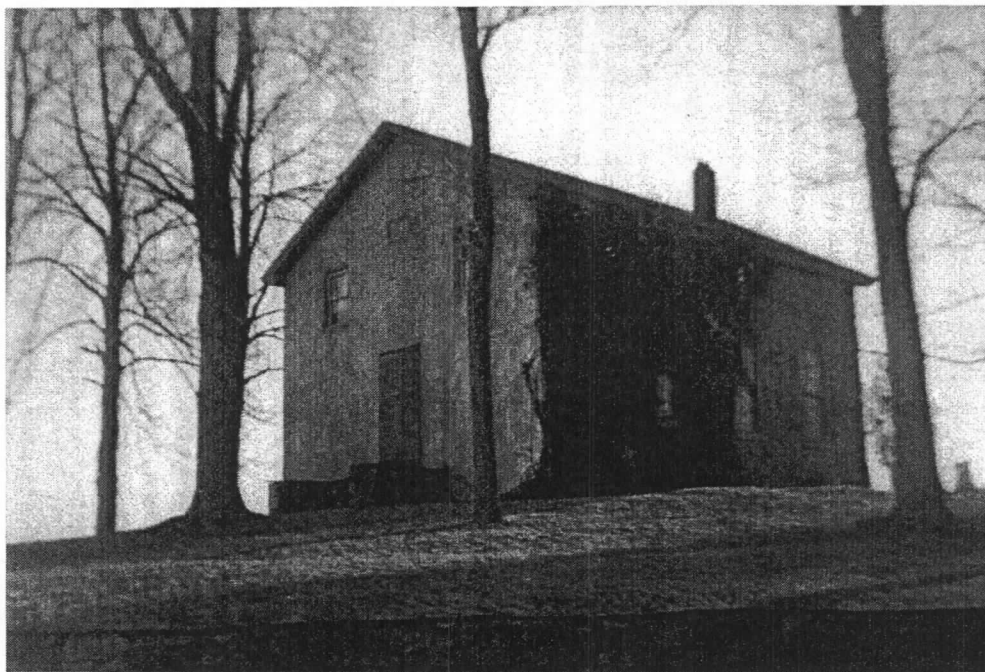

WATTERS MEETING HOUSE THOMAS RUN METHODIST CHURCH

Watters Meeting House (aka Thomas Run Church) is located on the south side of Kalmia Road just west of Thomas Run Road, in the Thomas Run Valley. This location is marked as "*Meth.Episc.Ch*" at "**Thomas Run P.O.**" on Martenet's 1878 Map of Harford County, in the area north of Bel Air.

HISTORY

The beginning of Methodism in Harford County is connected with Bush Chapel and Watters Meeting House. Preaching in Baltimore and Harford Counties began with the first Methodist itinerant preachers Strawbridge, Williams, and King. Robert Strawbridge is deserving of the largest amount of credit. Bush Chapel near Aberdeen was founded by Strawbridge. John Watters who lived in the Thomas Run Valley was a member of Bush Chapel. In 1770, he withdrew for the purpose of establishing a Methodist Society at his home. His youngest brother, William Watters, was converted while visiting him. William felt at once the call to preach and it is believed that he became the first native Methodist itinerant preacher.

The Watters Meeting House of Thomas Run was organized around 1771-1772. The exact date is not known. A log structure was built near the cemetery on land given by the Watters Family. The log structure burned and nothing remains. A field stone structure was built about 1840. The stone structure included a slave gallery with a separate outside entrance and steps. An architect who works with old buildings pointed-out, on a

slide of Thomas Run, where the outside second floor entrance to the slave gallery had been. The entrance has been sealed-off, and a stairway to the gallery is inside the building.

The General Conference of all Methodists met in 1777 here at the Watters Meeting House. In 1783, the property with enough land was deeded to a board of nine trustees of the church. They being: Joseph Foy, Daniel Sherardine, Skipwith Johns, Bernard Preston, James Fisher, Joseph Presbury, Sr., Walter Watters, William McComas, and Hollis Hanson.

The Watters' home was believed to have been located a few hundred yards from the church.

For many years early families attended services at Watters Meeting House (at Thomas Run). They came on foot, horseback, one-seater phaetons, two-seater daytons, and surreys.

Watters Meeting House was an integral part of the Darlington Charge, along with the Rock Run and Darlington Churches. Regular services were held at Watters Meeting House (Thomas Run) until 1945 when the Conference closed the church due to dwindling membership. In 1963, the Baltimore Conference sold the church to Mr. and Mrs. Lester Pyle of Bel Air, MD. They were very interested in preserving the church and grounds. In 1963, Mr. and Mrs. Pyle gave the church to the Thomas Run Foundation, Inc. a nonprofit organization formed to restore and preserve the building and grounds that is often referred to as the Thomas Run Methodist Church. Watters Meeting House is now on the National Register of Historic Places.

In 1965, extensive repairs were made to the church due to long years of not being occupied. In 1996, the church was burned by vandals, with only the exterior fieldstone walls left standing. The church interior has since been reconstructed with volunteer help and donations.

The history of Watters Meeting House (at Thomas Run) had been researched by Mrs. Blanche E. Pyle. Many of the very early Methodist records have been lost or misplaced over the years.

Of historic interest, Watters Meeting House (at Thomas Run) was founded and used for worship services during the lifetime of John and Charles Wesley who were the founders of Methodism.

Watters Meeting House is located in the Thomas Run Valley has also become commonly known as the Thomas Run Methodist Church, to help differentiate it from the William Watters Memorial Methodist Episcopal Church in Cooptown.
