## PREFACE

In these volumes, as in any other book you read, you will find mistakes. As you read the Special Schedule, you will notice mistakes made by the Enumerators and Clerks. For example, Confederate veterans names were marked through leaving them unreadable. Other times the names were legible and even misspelled. In the late 1800's there was still a lot of illiteracy; if a person could not read or spell he would generally make an "X," or somebody would write his name according to how it sounded. Some of the mistakes the proofreaders may have made may have included based on oral pronunciation, interpreting the spelling, where vowels may look like consonants and vice a verse. People may say we have spelled the name incorrectly and should spell the names according to how they are spelled today. According to twenty-first century standard this may be true in practice however, we should not change the method the Enumerators and Clerks used to spell names of the nineteen century. We are only trying to interpret the spelling of the Enumerators and Clerks of the latter century. We know that as education improved the spelling of names became more formal. That is why the proofreaders did not change the names so they would be spelled like they are today.

You will notice the following symbols "\*" which means the names was added by the Clerk to fill out the page for certain districts. The other symbol "√" means it is a duplicate of a name already on the schedule. On page xi you will see a copy from the microfilm of the original schedule which was used by the proofreaders. This will give you an idea as to what the proofreaders had to work with. Still to come in will be the volumes for Baltimore City and County.

In this volume there are some changes to Howard and Anne Arundel Counties. Numbers 4763 through 4773 should follow number 4713. In Anne Arundel County, part of the microfilm, which included two pages was duplicated. Numbers 4994 through 5019, the duplicated copies, follow number 5043. According to the microfilm, which was apparently microfilmed in Washington in 1948, according to the date at the beginning of the microfilm reel, number 123, roll 10.

In this third volume there are several Genealogical Societies and their members that I must thank for their time and effort in proof-reading their respective counties. Note.-The provision of the act of March 1, 1889, under which this special enumeration of survivors of the rebellion is made, reads as follows:

That said Superintendent shall, under the authority of the Secretary of the Interior, cause to be taken on a special schedule of inquiry, according to such form as he may prescribe, the names, organizations, and length of service of those who had served in the Army, or Marine Corps of the United States in the war of the rebellion, and who are survivors at the time of said inquiry, and the widows of Soldiers, Sailors, or Marines.

The entries concerning each survivor or widow should be carefully and accurately made, so that the printed reports may contain only thoroughly trustworthy information.

Spaces are provided on this special schedule for the entry of fifty names, or more properly, terms of service. The spaces are numbered consecutively from 1 to 50, and cover the four pages comprised in each schedule. The inquiries made concerning each survivor or widow call for the repetition of the number of the house and family as returned on the general population schedule (No. 1), the name, rank, company, regiment or vessel, date of enlistment, date of discharge, and length of service (in years, months, and days,) on the upper half of each page; and the post-office address, disability incurred, and general remarks on the lower half of each page. The column headed "Remarks" is intended to be used to cover any points not included in the foregoing inquiries, and which are necessary to a complete statement of a person's term of service in any one organization.

Spaces are provided on this special schedule for the entry of fifty names, or more properly, terms of service. The spaces are numbered consecutively from 1 to 50, and cover the four pages comprised in each schedule. The inquires made concerning each survivor or widow call for the repetition of the number of the house and family as returned on the general population schedule (No. 1), the name, rank, company, regiment or vessel, date of enlistment, date of discharge, and length of service (in years, months, and days,) on the upper half of each page, and the post-office address, disability incurred, and general remarks on the lower half of each page. The column headed "Remarks" is intended to be used to cover any points not included in the foregoing inquiries, and which are necessary to a complete statement of a person's term of service in any one organization.

In the case of persons having served in more than one organization, use as many spaces as may be necessary to cover their various terms of service. In case of windows of deceased soldiers, sailors, or marines, make the entry of her name on the dotted line, as follows:

Note.-The provision of the act of March 1, 1889, under which this special enumeration of survivors of the rebellion is made, reads as follows:

That said Superintendent shall, under the authority of the Secretary of the Interior, cause to be taken on a special schedule of inquiry, according to such form as he may prescribe, the names, organizations, and length of service of those who had served in the Army, or Marine Corps of the United States in the war of the rebellion, and who are survivors at the time of said inquiry, and the widows of Soldiers, Sailors, or Marines.

The entries concerning each survivor or widow should be carefully and accurately made, so that the printed reports may contain only thoroughly trustworthy information.

Spaces are provided on this special schedule for the entry of fifty names, or more properly, terms of service. The spaces are numbered consecutively from 1 to 50, and cover the four pages comprised in each schedule. The inquiries made concerning each survivor or widow call for the repetition of the number of the house and family as returned on the general population schedule (No. 1), the name, rank, company, regiment or vessel, date of enlistment, date of discharge, and length of service (in years, months, and days,) on the upper half of each page, and the post-office address, disability incurred, and general remarks on the lower half of each page. The column headed "Remarks" is intended to be used to cover any points not included in the foregoing inquiries, and which are necessary to a complete statement of a person's term of service in any one organization.

In the case of persons having served in more than one organization, use as many spaces as may be necessary to cover their various terms of service. In case of windows of deceased soldiers, sailors, or marines, make the entry of her name on the dotted line, as follows: Mary J., widow of
